The Lost Wonderland Diaries

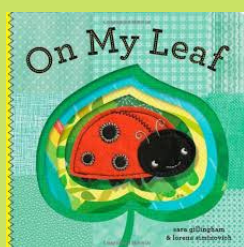

On My Leaf

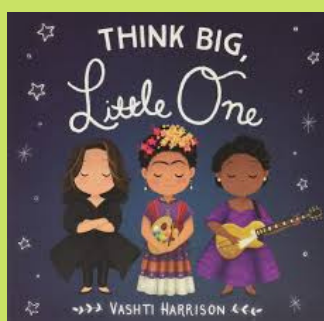

Think Big, Little One

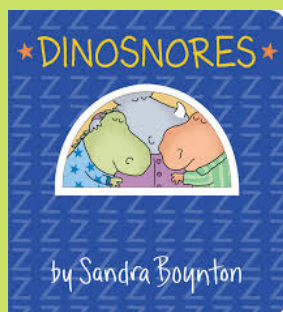

King and the Dragonflies

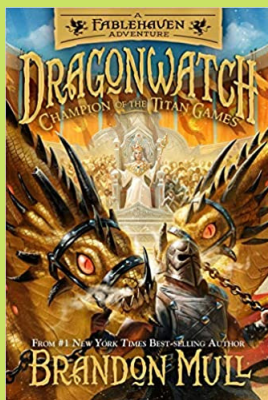
